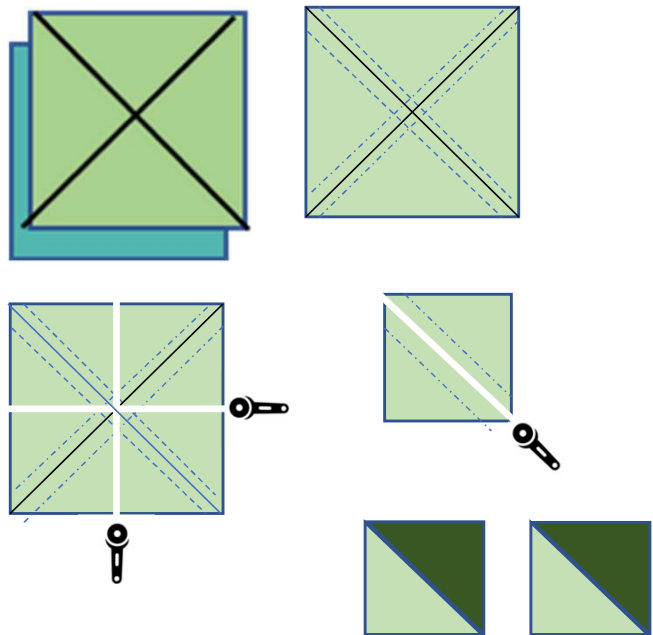


# 8 Half Square Triangles At A Time Reference Sheet

When making multiple HST, this method will give you (8) at a time. Making them bigger and trimming them down is the most accurate way. Use the table below to determine the size to cut your squares (measured in inches).

| HST UNFINISHED | HST FINISHED | SQUARE SIZE |
|----------------|--------------|-------------|
| 1              | 1/2          | 3           |
| 1-1/2          | 1            | 4           |
| 2              | 1-1/2        | 5           |
| 2-1/2          | 2            | 6           |
| 3              | 2-1/2        | 7           |
| 3-1/2          | 3            | 8           |
| 4              | 3-1/2        | 9           |
| 4-1/2          | 4            | 10          |
| 5              | 4-1/2        | 11          |
| 5-1/2          | 5            | 12          |
| 6              | 5-1/2        | 13          |
| 6-1/2          | 6            | 14          |
| 7              | 6-1/2        | 15          |
| 7-1/2          | 7            | 16          |
| 8              | 7-1/2        | 17          |
| 8-1/2          | 8            | 18          |
| 9              | 8-1/2        | 19          |
| 9-1/2          | 9            | 20          |
| 10             | 9-1/2        | 21          |
| 10-1/2         | 10           | 22          |
| 11             | 10-1/2       | 23          |
| 11-1/2         | 11           | 24          |
| 12             | 11-1/2       | 25          |

- Draw diagonal lines on the wrong side of one square
- Place the square on top of another square, right side together
- Sew 1/4" on each side of drawn lines
- Cut the square into four equal parts
- Cut the quadrants apart on the drawn line
- Trim HST to the unfinished size
